Munyonyo – President Yoweri Kaguta Museveni, on January 19 2024, was elected chair of the Non-Aligned Movement at the 19th summit, taking over leadership from H.E Ilham Aliyev, the President of Azerbaijan, for a three year term.

In his speech, President Museveni acknowledged that NAM was faultless as emerging developments needn't cause friction, emphasizing that its emergence was a necessary antidote to the irrational polarization of the World of that time between the Capitalist Western countries and the Communist, mainly Eastern countries. He stated, Uganda's position is that the world should focus on

addressing the common human problems to secure a bright future. H.E. the President shared that the strength of NAM should be used to exercise considerable influence particularly at the UN for the effective transformative process for a better common future.

"In the negotiations for the Pact of the Future, the outcome document of the upcoming United Nations Summit of the Future to be held in New York in September, 2024, we should clearly define priorities that favour developing countries by maintaining unity, solidarity and collective coordination among our Member States, in line with the Bandung principles." he said.

He went on to express dismay and scorn for the intellectual, ideological, and strategic shallowness of certain world actors who claim to be democrats but in turn want to impose ideologies by manipulating and threatening as opposed to influencing people by their good example.

“ Our stand is that the World should concentrate on the common human problems — prosperity through trade, the advance of science and technology to deal with human problems, the environment, crime and terrorism. The future is bright if we act right. These are, indeed, the Bandung principles.

Munyonyo – On January 17, 2024, Uganda’s Vice President H.E. Maj. (Rtd) Jessica Alupo, while kicking off the XIX NAM Ministerial Meeting, emphasized the need for member states to maintain cooperativeness in order to achieve mutual goals. “We should reaffirm our commitment to maintaining cohesion amongst ourselves in all issues of common interest, to promoting our common positions with relevant multilateral forum,” said VP Alupo. She added that deepening cooperation is the best mutually benefiting way to create global wealth and affluence but would require removing all barriers that impede success.



Barriers mentioned included lack of; enough infrastructure to support industrialization, human capacity to effectively manage the extractive industry, financial resources and investment in strategic sectors of the economy, limited knowledge and use of ICT platforms, slow progress in industrialization and limited inter and intra-regional trade among NAM member states.




42nd IGAD Heads of State and Government Assembly Discusses Sudan, Ethiopia And Somalia.

Entebbe - The 42nd Extraordinary Assembly of the IGAD Heads of State and Government was held on Thursday, 18th January 2024, in Entebbe, on the situation in the Republic of the Sudan and recent developments regarding the relation between the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia and the Federal Republic of Somalia.

The Assembly was chaired by H.E. Ismail Omar Guelleh, President of the Republic of Djibouti and the Chairperson of the IGAD Heads of State and Government and was attended by: H.E. Dr. William Ruto, President of the Republic of Kenya; H.E. Dr. Hassan Sheikh Mohamud, President of the Federal Republic of Somalia; H.E. Salva Kiir Mayardit, President of the Republic of South Sudan; H.E. Yoweri Kaguta Museveni, President of the Republic of Uganda. The Assembly first extended its congratulations to Uganda and President Yoweri Museveni for the successful organization of the event, which also included the Non-Aligned Movement and the G77 + China Summits.

Central to the discussions was the concern regarding the relationship between Ethiopia and Somalia. The Assembly reiterated the cardinal principles of respecting Somalia's sovereignty, unity, and territorial integrity, emphasizing that any engagement between the two countries should be conducted with the consent of the Federal Government of Somalia. Furthermore, the Assembly called upon both Ethiopia and Somalia to de-escalate tensions and engage in constructive dialogue. The Assembly also expressed deep concern about the ongoing conflict in Sudan, highlighting the severe security and humanitarian consequences. They reiterated the call for an immediate ceasefire and cessation of hostilities to create a conducive environment for a political dialogue. IGAD's commitment to facilitating an all-inclusive peace process in close collaboration with all Sudanese stakeholders, the African Union, and regional and international actors was reaffirmed.

The Assembly also called for a revision of the Roadmap for the Resolution of the Conflict in Sudan within one month and the convening of a Sudanese-owned and Sudanese-led process towards establishing a democratic government in Sudan. In conclusion, the assembly welcomed the appointment of a High-Level Panel for Sudan by the Chairperson of the African Union Commission and urged the panel to work closely with IGAD and other stakeholders in facilitating the peace process.



Highlights of the Third South Summit of the Group of 77 and China, 2024

Munyonyo - The 3rd south summit of the Group of 77 and China, kicked off with the Senior Officials meeting on 18th January 2024. The representatives from member states met to consider the draft outcome document, which was adopted with emphasis on the need for the Group of 77 to tackle urgent, & international issues affecting developing countries.



While opening the session of the senior officials, Permanent Secretary Bagiiire Vincent Waiswa (pictured) noted that the G77 was meeting at a time when the world is faced with multiple challenges, including geopolitical upheavals and economic and financial chall-

enges, among others, in several countries. PS Bagiiire further noted that the G77+China should utilize the opportunity and play an important role to strengthen a more inclusive & prosperous world. He stated that the member states need to accelerate implementation of the 2030 Agenda to sustain their governments. "The implementation is lagging. It is therefore imperative that concerted efforts be made to scale up the organisation of resources in terms of financial, capacity-building, and technology requests to deliver the agenda," the Permanent Secretary noted.

He thanked the leadership of Cuba, especially Ambassador Pedro Luis Pedrosso Cuesta, the Chair of the G77+China, for tremendously chairing the previous summit in China in 2023, and welcomed the delegates to Uganda.

President Museveni advocates for Trade across the Global South

While delivering his closing remarks at the 19th NAM summit, H.E. the President reiterated the importance of following the Bandung principles, particularly the value of humility. He stressed the need to recognise that there are multiple valid perspectives and ways of doing things which must be respected. He also emphasized the significance of promoting stronger trade ties among NAM member countries as it contributes to our shared prosperity. To the brothers and sisters outside Africa, He emphasized Africa's immense potential and economic opportunities. He thanked all the member countries for coming to Uganda and giving us the honour of chairing the Non-Aligned Movement for the next three years.

Highlights of the Third South Summit of the Group of 77 and China, 2024

While receiving the one-year chairmanship mandate from Cuba, H.E. the President Yoweri Kaguta Museveni described it as “an opportune time” because the Group of 77 and China will mark its 60th anniversary this year. President Museveni said the Group of 77 continues to **“yearn for a revitalized multilateral system which is capable of adequately addressing current and emerging global challenges”**.

The G77+China, he said, is firm in its belief of multilateralism remaining a fundamental and crucial mechanism for addressing our common challenges together as nations in solidarity”. H.E. the President underlined that it is critical that the coalition remains “united in its pursuit of collective interests” at the United Nations. “In the intergovernmental processes at the United Nations, we must ensure that priorities of the Group of 77 are promoted and defended. “I assure you that my team, led by the Permanent Re-

presentative in New York, has my full support to chair the Group of 77 and China. President Museveni said Uganda’s chairmanship will strive to further promote, among others: Acceleration of the implementation of the 2030 Agenda; Scaling up action to address climate change & biodiversity loss; Strengthening international tax cooperation; Financing for development; Fight against illicit financial flows and strengthening digital cooperation. The UN Secretary General, and the President of the UN General Assembly (pictured below) spoke at the pening session of the Third south summit of the G77. Both H.E. Antonio Guterres and H.E. Dennis Frances called for an



immediate humanitarian ceasefire and the immediate and unconditional release of all hostages in Gaza. They also called for a reform of the global financial system that has failed to provide a global safety net for developing countries in distress.

H.E. Liu Guozhong, Chinese President Xi Jinping’s Special Representative, addressed the summit “as a special guest”. He underlined China’s commitment to continue supporting the Global South in a determined quest to **‘leave no one behind’**.



“Working closely with over 20 international organizations, China has implemented over 130 trilateral co-operation projects in nearly 60 countries in the areas such as poverty reduction, food security, public health and climate change.” H.E. Guozhong (pictured above) shared that China will continue to take South-South co-operation with countries as a priority, stand together, and work with G77 members and contribute to the common development of countries of the South with its philosophy and progress in pursuit of Chinese modernization.”




Danish Government extends support to Uganda for climate and change and refugees.

On Wednesday, 24th January, 2024, President Museveni held a meeting with Mr. Dan Jorgensen, Danish Envoy and Minister for Development, Cooperation & Global Climate Policy and his delegation at State Lodge Nakasero. In light of mitigating the effects of climate change and providing assistance to refugees, the Danish Government extended their support of \$95 million (Sh362 billion). This will help support the country's wetland reclamation program, and addressing the issue of illegal rice growers in swamps that serve as sources of rainfall in Uganda.



Japan's Envoy ends tour of duty, bids Uganda farewell.



Amb. Fukuzawa Hidemoto, outgoing Ambassador of Japan to Uganda, paid a farewell courtesy visit to the Minister of State for Regional Cooperation, Hon. John Mulimba, on 8th February 2024. During the meeting, Amb. Hidemoto highlighted milestone projects between Uganda and Japan, such as the Source of the Nile Jinja Bridge and the Kampala Flyover Project. Both parties affirmed their commitment to promoting people-to-people exchange and cultural cooperation to enhance mutual understanding and development. They also discussed areas of cooperation i.e. infrastructure, education, & healthcare, with the Minister emphasizing the need to further enhance trade and investment.

MFA signs MOU with UAE at the World Governments Summit 2024.

Hon. Gen. Odongo Jeje Abubakher represented President Museveni at the 2024 edition of The World Governments Summit, held from the 12th to the 14th of February under the theme 'Shaping Future Governments'. During the summit, there were joint efforts to promote institutional capabilities and enhance governance in the field of developing government work, building institutional capacities, and skills for the future. Gen. Odongo, the Minister of Foreign Affairs of Uganda, and H.E. Mohammad Abdullah Al Gergawi, Minister of Cabinet Affairs, United Arab Emirates, signed a Memorandum of Understanding, emphasizing the commitment of both countries to further cooperation and development in these areas.

The recent visit of Ms. Suja K. Menon, Joint Secretary/Director General for the Ministry of External Affairs of India in charge of Lines of Credit, marked a significant step in strengthening the partnership between India and Uganda. The three-day visit, aimed at following up on the utilization of two lines of credit offered by the Government of India, highlighted key areas of cooperation, particularly in agriculture and energy.

During her visit, Ms. Suja K. Menon engaged with Ugandan officials and stakeholders, including the Ministry of Agriculture, Animal Industry and Fisheries (MAAIF) and the Ministry of Energy and Mineral Development (MoEMD). The MAAIF submitted a project proposal for a Solar Irrigation Systems Project, aligning with Uganda's priorities to enhance agricultural productivity and the efficiency of the Parish Development Model. On the energy front, the MoEMD proposed two projects for consideration, including the 220kv Bujagaali-Tororo Transmission Line project and the Karuma-Nimule-Juba Transmission Line project. These projects, totaling 127km and 712km respectively, aim to enhance Uganda's energy infrastructure and contribute to regional energy security.

The visit also included on-site assessment visits to the proposed project sites. Delegates visited the Bujagaali power site and two Micro-scale irrigation projects in Busedde sub-county, gaining valuable insights into the potential impact of these projects on local communities. In addition to the focus on infrastructure projects, the visit also explored opportunities for people-to-people cooperation. In Jinja City, the delegation met with local officials and discussed potential projects in tourism, culture, and the digital economy. The proposal to construct a Heritage Centre to commemorate Mahatma Gandhi's ashes, scattered at the source of the Nile, was particularly well-received as a symbol of the enduring alliance between the people of India and Uganda. Overall, Ms. Suja K. Menon's visit underscored India's commitment to enhancing its partnership with Uganda across various sectors. The proposed projects have the potential to not only strengthen bilateral ties but also contribute to Uganda's socio-economic development.

Uganda Re-elected to the African Union Peace and Security Council.

Addis Ababa - On 15 February 2024, Uganda was re-elected to the African Union Peace and Security Council (PSC) for a second two-year term from 2024-2026, edging out Ethiopia and Eritrea during the 44th Ordinary Session of the AU Executive Council. East Africa had four candidates for the two seats up for grabs, with Tanzania also winning re-election for the second East African seat.

This re-election marks Uganda's sixth term on the Council, having previously served for a total of 11 years. Speaking from Addis Ababa, Minister of Foreign Affairs, Hon. Jeje Odongo, attributed Uganda's re-election to President Yoweri Kaguta Museveni's strong and exemplary leadership on regional peace and security issues. During its current term, Uganda has actively engaged in critical issues affecting the continent, including advocating for adequate financing of AU-led peace support operations. This effort led to the adoption of UN Security Council resolution 2719 (2023), allowing AU-led operations to access UN assessed contributions for up to 75% of their annual budget.

President Museveni on Working Visit to Zanzibar



Arusha - The EAC Secretary General Hon Dr. Peter Mutuku Mathuki met a high-level Ugandan delegation led by Foreign Affairs Permanent Secretary, Hon. Vincent Baguire, at the EAC Headquarters in Arusha, Tanzania, on 21st February 2024. The talks revolved around infrastructure development, energy, cross-boundary matters, shared natural resources, intra-regional trade, single currency, peace and security, and political federation.

Dr. Mathuki emphasised the need to make the community borderless through increased efforts and investment to boost intra-regional trade. On his part, Hon. Baguire said that intra-regional trade can not prosper when there are many obstacles, including Non-tariff barriers, high costs of energy, air tickets, and dilapidated infrastructure, among other factors. PS Baguire noted that the bloc was expanding rapidly through increased population and markets, even as he hailed the gradual implementation by Partner States of the EAC One Network Area that is aimed at harmonising mobile calling and data charges. The officials' visit also included courtesy calls to relevant organisations such as the East African Business Council, Pan African Postal Union, ESAMI, East African Legislative Assembly, and East African Court of Justice. PS Baguire and the delegation interacted with the Heads of the EAC institutions listed, and also engaged staff at the Uganda Liaison Office in Arusha to gain insights into their roles and discuss strategies for enhanced effectiveness.



Uganda calls for Collective Action in Addressing Global Environment at the UN Environment Assembly

Nairobi - The Sixth Session of the United Nations Environment Assembly (UNEA6) met in Nairobi, from 26th February to 1st March, 2024. Hon. Sam Mangusho Cheptoris, Minister of Water and Environment, and head of Uganda's delegation, highlighted Uganda's efforts in addressing global environmental challenges, **i.e.** climate change, biodiversity loss, and pollution. Hon. Cheptoris urged nations to embrace green and circular economy approaches, emphasizing the need for collective responsibility in protecting the planet. He called for a shift away from greed-

Geneva - In a national statement delivered on 5th March 2024, at the 55th Session of the Human Rights Council in Geneva, Uganda lauded South Sudan for progress made in the implementation of the Revitalized Agreement and congratulated the Parties to the conflict for the progress made. The statement, delivered by Uganda Mission Geneva Representative and Expert on Human Rights, Ms. Mary Namono Kibere, addressed the enhanced interactive dialogue on the Human Rights situation in South Sudan. Ms. Kibere informed the Council that, as a neighbour and one of the guarantors to the Revitalized Agreement on the Resolution of the Conflict in the Republic of South Sudan (R-ARCSS), Uganda continues to follow closely the situation in South Sudan with keen interest. Ms. Kibere called for the international community to support and work with the Government of South Sudan and the region for sustainable peace, security, and development.

While in Antalya, Gen. Odongo, accompanied by the Uganda's Head of Mission in Türkiye H.E. Nusura Tiperu also met representatives of several Turkish enterprises and invited them to invest in the different priority sectors of Uganda's economy. The MFA tasked the Embassy in Ankara to follow up with the prospective investors, directly link them to the relevant sector regulators and facilitate them exploit the business and investment opportunities in Uganda.



On the margins of the ADF, Minister Odongo met H.E. Hakan Fidan, Foreign Minister of the Republic of Türkiye. Gen. Odongo lauded the fraternal relations that exist between the two countries and expressed appreciation to Türkiye for all the assistance extended, such as, infrastructural development, education cooperation through scholarships, foreign direct investment among other areas of cooperation. The Turkish Minister of Foreign Affairs congratulated Uganda on the successful hosting of the NAM and G77 plus China Summits held in Kampala.


